## Weekly Syllabus

The continued study of functional harmony and the study of non-functional harmony and modal harmony (Emphasis on writing).

### Week 1

- Review of Harmony 2A
- Parallel modes of major, melodic minor and harmonic minor. 21 modes on each tone.
- A look into how these modes sound and function in a modal environment

## Week 2

- Modal interchange reharmonization
- Bass interchange reharmonization

Homework: Compose a tune using these techniques

Play through compositions as a class

#### Week 4

- The study of cycles outside of functional harmony: Cycles 2, 3, 4 and 5
- A look into tunes that use a variety of cycles and modal sounds ex.: "Litha", "Time Remembered", "4 by 5", "Passion Dance", "Maiden Voyage"

#### Week 5

 Further study of cycles tunes as they relate to functional harmony "Turn out the Stars", "Quiet Now", "I'm all Smiles"

Homework: Compose a tune using cycle material

### Week 6

Play through compositions as a class

### Week 7

- John Coltraine's cycle 3 and several variations
- Study of standards reharmonized using this technique.

Homework: Composition based on the lesson.

### Week 8

Play through compositions together in class

#### Week 9

- Upper structured 7<sup>th</sup> chords. A look into how US 7<sup>th</sup> can be used over another 7<sup>th</sup> chord to create more tension in the basic harmony.
- We will create some in class

Homework: Compose tune

#### Week 10

Play through compositions in class

#### Week 11

- Hexatonic and pentatonic compositions.
- A look into how to create lines/melodies using these techniques
- We create some in class

Homework: Compose tune

#### Week 12

Play tune in class

## Week 13

- 12 tone composition
- We will compose some lines in class

#### Week 14

A look at a few classical piano pieces and how to adapt them for a jazz environment.

Homework: Choose lesson 13 or 14 and compose tune.

#### Week 15

We play compositions in class.

## Learning Outcome:

In this semester all students are expected to compose approximately 5 or 6 tunes, each tune should reflect the lesson that was studied in the prior class. Every lesson will reflect a specific technique ranging from simple lyrical melody writing with pentatonics to more complex 12-tone lines. It is imperative that the compositions show insight and skill in the specific technique that the composition is based on. See the weekly syllabus for specific studies.
